- Provide statistical handouts
- Discuss how the Internet used for trafficking as well as risks for runaway teens
- Display books or a book list related to human trafficking
- Show a short film
- Display ABC Missionaries involvement
- Invite a speaker
- Interaction—have girls write letters to missionaries, hang newsprint titled: "How Can I Help?" using the information for a future AB GIRLS gathering.
