2020 — ABWM Hosts Courageous Conversation: Youth and Young Adult Ministry During a Pandemic Webinar

On Thursday, April 16, 2020, American Baptist Women's Ministries (ABWM) hosted a Courageous Conversation with youth ministers and college chaplains from around the nation. The webinar discussed the challenges and opportunities for ministry with youth and young adults during COVID-19. Examining ways to do youth and young adult ministry during a pandemic has left many youth workers with more questions than answers. Participants learned effective practices to engage young people's theological, social, and emotional needs. Also, participants learned self-care practices that they can implement as they seek to empower young people in their communities. Participants noted that they left the webinar with a new awareness and resources to help young people navigate the impact of COVID-19 in their lives. Rev. Gina Jacobs-Strain, executive director at ABWM, stated, "while COVID-19 brought us together, I am optimistic that the Courageous Conversation webinars will begin something that we can continue beyond this season.
