many of you attending the Winter Webinar series, Let the Walls Fall Down.

We are blessed to start the year with a One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) Development Grant from American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) to develop leadership opportunities for women and girls. The grant will support a new ministry project called "Be Strong, Be Courageous: Leadership Training for Women and Girls," which will provide opportunities to study God's word and develop leadership acumen. You may have seen the recent press release about it. The grant enhances and supports ABWM's mission, vision, and core values. This grant will support webinars as well as workshops presented by leadership development experts at the 2024 National Women and Girls Conference. The event will be held at Roanoke College, in Roanoke, VA, on July 18-21, 2024. Participants will build confidence and curiosity as they expand biblical knowledge, delve into equity concepts, advocacy, self-esteem, team building, mentor/mentee relationships, and leadership opportunities at all levels.

The rationale for the 2023 Mission Theme Racial Justice, is on the website. Thanks to all that contributed to the research and resources provided.

Let us lean into our ministries with deep gratitude and intentional actions that make space for all women. God is moving amongst us and blessing us!



Alumnae Undates

The alumnae of American Baptist Women's Ministries made up of former elected and appointed officers, region/state presidents, staff, consultants, advisors, National Leadership Team of AB GIRLS, and program board representatives, have been connecting through Zoom. 

The first webinar, Faith and Wellbeing, will take place on Thursday, February 23, 2023, at 8:00 PM (EST). We are excited to feature Rachel Legg, a mental health therapist who has been providing counseling in the community mental health setting for three years.

The second webinar, Faith and Yoga, will take place on Thursday, April 20, 2023, at 8:00 PM (EST). We will be blessed by Jasmine Turner, an Emmy-award-winning anchor, and reporter for NBC 12 News in Richmond, Virginia, who is a certified yoga and meditation teacher.

Continue to look for the presence of the Young Adult Women's Ministry throughout this year. From helping with the AB GIRLS Hangout to Women's History Month Gatherings and the October Shalom Retreat, we are active across all facets of ABWM.

Mission Projects for Young Adult Women

A mission project, no matter how small, should be carefully coordinated. As we embark into a new year, this could be a wonderful opportunity to coordinate a mission project with the young adult women in your church or group. It is okay to start small and within everyone's capacity to be involved. Take an inventory of the talents and gifts of your group of young adult women participants. Work on aligning your group's strengths to a need in your church or community. It might even be appropriate to team up with an organization that already has roots in your chosen mission project. Building and sustaining relationships is a hugely important part of any mission project. These relationships include your group members, community members, mission project partners, etc.

Some examples of mission projects include:

- Exercise/Healthcare developing a space for community members to exercise, hold workout classes, or start a youth sports program
- Career Readiness/Resume Writing hold seminars and career fairs, coordinate with a college in town
- Clothing Closets collect donations and have a location for people to shop or teach sewing classes
- Cooking/Meal Preparation teach smart shopping, tips for finding the best deals and eliminating waste
- Community Garden engage other churches, neighborhoods, and city officials to save green spaces

Happy New Year! Cue party horns and streamers. One of the ways that you can celebrate the

new year is to plan an event for your women that aligns with ABWM's mission, vision, and purpose. To do that, you must, of course, know what those are!

Mission: American Baptist Women's Ministries is a Christ-centered ministry with a commitment to encourage and empower women and girls to serve God.

Vision: Every American Baptist church shall have a vital women's ministry program that empowers women and girls to become and develop as God's person, build God's faith community, and serve God's world.

Purpose: As servant leaders, we serve American Baptist churches by encouraging existing vital ministries with women and girls and empowering churches to build such ministries.

Did you know that to be a fully recognized American Baptist Women's group, you must align with the national mission, vision, and purpose? There are legal and tax implications to using the name for purposes (including fundraising) that are not in alignment.

Let's briefly look at our Purpose. An event that raises funds for another ministry, no matter how important, that does not serve women and girls is not aligned. Two examples of this: serving women who are overseas or serving the developmentally disabled. This is Godly work. It is important. But it is not the work to which this ministry is called. Should you raise funds for this? Yes, just not under the name of American Baptist Women's Ministries.

Consider having a speaker that focuses on American Baptist Women's Ministries' mission. Did you know that ABWM's national officers and staff can speak at your ABWM event?

As you review your documents and plan your program this year, please also review our Mission, Vision, and Purpose, and take steps to ensure your local alignment.

Racism will not be fully eliminated until Jesus returns, but we must actively work to eradicate it and oppose oppression. Combat racism, America's original sin, with prayer regularly. Ask God to heal these wounds in our country.

Pray: God, aid us in overcoming this blight from our hearts, communities, our social and civil institutions so that we may work with you in healing the USA. Wake us up, Lord, so that racism finds no home here. Remove any barriers to your grace that may oppress and offend my sisters. Empower us to love our neighbors who may not know you so that it serves as a sign and symbol of the goodness of the gospel. Finally, remind us, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God." Amen.

National Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month

"Abuse is not just about broken bones, bruises or black eyes but includes telling someone what to do, what to wear, who to see, constantly putting them down, making them do sexual acts they don't want to do." -- Anonymous

As we know, teen dating can be very complicated and confusing. Understanding relationships requires more maturity than most teens have developed. A lack of communication, jealousy, and selfishness are likely to consume these relationships. Adverse childhood experiences can also be a trigger for teen dating violence, such as:

- experiencing violence, abuse, or neglect
- witnessing violence in the home
- having a family member attempt or die by suicide.

There is also the child's/teen's environment to take into consideration:

- substance use
- mental health
- instability due to parental separation or household members being in prison.

These are just a few examples showing how challenging teen dating can be. Therefore, it is very

important to understand the behaviors that may point to an unhealthy and/or abusive



relationship which takes on many different forms.

- Invasion of privacy
- Unexpected bouts of anger
- Unusual moodiness
- Pressuring a partner into unwanted sexual
- Blaming problems in the relationship and not taking any responsibility for the same
- Constantly monitoring whereabouts and checking in to see what you are doing and with whom.

The examples listed above that are visibly noticeable in teen dating violence. It has been found that negative or abusive behavior in unhealthy relationships is more likely to increase over time if not dealt with early in the relationship. 


