- We assure that our diversity (clergy/lay, age, geographic, and racial/ethnic representation) as a denomination is represented in our ministries.

- We affirm and encourage the use of spiritual gifts.
- · We recognize the worth of all women and girls.
- We value our American Baptist family relationships.
- We work to provide solutions for the social justice challenges and opportunities facing women and girls.

Our Bylaws remind us that we are "a diverse community of American Baptist women and girls serving in ministry in Christ's name in the US, including Puerto Rico. With local, area, region/state, and national levels of ministry, American Baptist Women's Ministries create and sustain communities of passionately faithful, mission-minded women and girls engaged in worship, service, and friendship."

How BLESSED we are, ABWM Sisters, to have such a rich history of lifting, encouraging, supporting, and empowering women and girls across the United States, including Puerto Rico. When we align our work with our historical mission, vision, purpose, and core values, we create even greater opportunities to accomplish our goals.

The Bible Tells Me

The first five books of the Law presented the idea of "Welcoming the Stranger" no less than 36 times to remind the Children of

Israel that they were once "Strangers in a strange land." When we are strangers in a strange land (like going to a woman's retreat for the first time), we learn empathy, resilience, and the shared human experience of displacement.

Currently, I am in an awesome Bible study of Moses Law, or the Torah, led by Rev. Dr. Marilyn Bennett. We have studied Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and are almost finished with Deuteronomy. I have learned so much from this study–it makes you think.

When we studied Leviticus and its many laws, I jokingly asked Pastor Marilyn if I would be required to memorize all 613. She said I only need to remember the two that Jesus quotes from the Old Testament: You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these. Mark 12:30-31

Remembering to welcome the stranger is a way of keeping Jesus' command to show God's love. Who is the stranger in your life right now, and how can you welcome her?
